Then we can definitely help each other!

Did You Know...?

Due to the recession and poor state of our economy, our students struggle to remain in school. First it was that they would still come, but take less credits per semester; but with the economy not improving greatly at the level of the individual family, many have to drop out, and those who fight on to stay, while doing the bare minimum number of credits, struggle and struggle and struggle.

Just imagine how hard it is to do well in school with financial burdens weighing you down every day. So financial challenges are a double-edged sword for our students who wish to do well academically, but just can't afford the tuition, accommodation and other fees.

Perhaps you experienced that while you were here? Or perhaps you had classmates you had to help out so they could finish their programme? Or perhaps you know students now, who can't finish their course of study?

Here in the Alumni Relations Office we get requests from students directly or through their faculty and administrative units to assist with funding for:

- Tuition
- Accommodation
- Class projects
- Student services events

Mostly, we have to turn down the requests, because the University is affected by the recession and poor economy too. UTech, Jamaica has received a declining subvention from the Government over time, as the Government increases its funding for its greater priority of Early Childhood Education.

In practical terms, among other areas, the University is unable to give Alumni Relations a robust budget. So we cannot respond adequately to student requests, nor can we do the quality and variety of programming necessary to engage you as an Alumn in order to support your personal, professional and business development, in the way we would like to; and in ways that would help stimulate your own growth and achievements despite the recession.

You are the reason our office exists, and we want to serve you better and in more value-adding ways. You might have realized that our office has one staff member, and no administrative support and our contacts database is a very simple one. With an Alumni Diaspora of 58,000+ this is far from what is needed to properly serve, support and engage you.

And how does the University currently help students with financial need? We have a Welfare Office which gives grants based on need. But look at the numbers though.

The Welfare Fund

Is currently financed by students contribution...taken from their fees. The benefits given are:

- Tuition - \$20,000 (max)
- Lunch subsidy \$200 per day per Academic Year
- Bus Pass with JUTC - \$500 per week per Academic Year
- Medical Expenses per recommendation from Medical Centre - \$20,000 (max)
- Boarding Fees - \$20,000 (max)

What do you think of those numbers, given the cost-of-living at this time and the reality of a devaluing dollar? And given that the Welfare Fund is financed from tuition, we don't have to tell you how the Welfare Fund is impacted, if less students can afford to attend per semester.

So how can we help each other?
