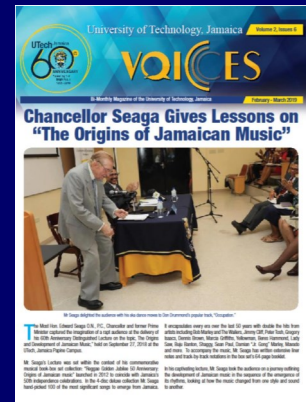
Technology in Focus | Jamaica Pushes Towards Digital Society Goal
